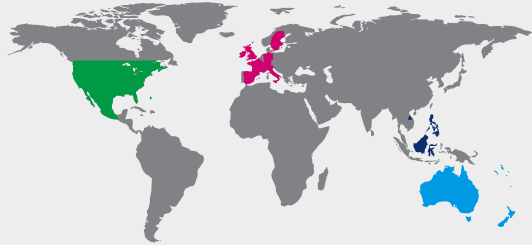


# Global Disaster Relief & Climate Resilience Partnership
